Geetha and Mohan:

Geetha and Mohan have been married for 8 years and had no children. Because they desired a family, they consulted multiple doctors, took different medicine, participated in religious pilgrimages, and visited witch doctors. None of their efforts resulted in a pregnancy. They eventually visited Immanuel Bible Church (a GBBM Church) at the invitation of Rama Mandari. Pastor Sathyam and the church started praying for them.



Geetha continued to attend the church and after six months Mohan joined her at church and in prayer. After attending the church for a year, Geetha

conceived, and by God's Grace they were blessed with a daughter. We praise God for this miracle and pray they continue to grow in their Christian faith and follow Christ for rest of their lives.

Mamatha Baarik:

Mamatha and Chandu Baarik were blessed with a daughter ten years ago. Since that time, Mamatha has been humiliated by her husband and family members for not bearing a son to carry on their family name. Chandu is an alcoholic, he has threatened to divorce Mamatha and marry another woman to give him a son. Mamatha knew of a GBBM church in her area and visited ~ 9 months ago. Pastor Sathyam and the church started praying for Mamatha and her situation. To her surprise, she became pregnant 5 months after attending church. Please join us in praying for Mamatha and her family. Chandu is opposed to her church attendance, we pray his heart is softened and that he joins her in church attendance. We pray for his recovery from addiction, we pray that the Lord gives them a child that they love and cherish.



Naagu and Sharada Naik

Naagu Naik and his family had been struggling with many issues. Naagu has polio, the family's chicken selling business was suffering and their oldest daughter Bhavitha had on-going unexplained health issues. The family believed Bhavitha's health problems were associated with witchcraft. To counteract the witchcraft, they began

offering sacrifices to the Banjara gods and goddesses. They consulted a witchdoctor to help with the issues but neither their daughter's health nor their financial problems improved. As their business plunged further into debt and Bhavitha's health deteriorated, they lost all hope.



Finding no relief from their problems, they met with Pastor Sakram Naik. Pastor Sakram consoled the family, prayed for them, and frequently visited them. Pastor Sakram shared the Gospel, and their faith grew. But the people in the village were not pleased with the Naik family. They mocked them when they were praying and rejected them for worshipping an "American god". They refused to associate with the family. However, Naagu and his family's faith in Jesus Christ gave

them the strength to ignore the persecution. Pastor Sakram continued to support Naagu and his family and to strengthen them spiritually. The entire family was convinced Jesus Christ is the living God and only through His blood are one's sins washed away. They believed the Gospel, confessed their sins, and witnessed in baptism.

In His timing, the Lord blessed this family. Bhavitha regained her health, The family opened a new vegetable shop in their village. Naagu was able to acquire land which is providing a good income. The family dug a borewell which yielded springs of water for agricultural use. They have become a blessing for many Banjara families in the village by providing work. The family continues to grow in their love for our Saviour and Lord, Jesus Christ. Please join us in our prayers that this family can serve as salt and light in their village.
