Dear Brethren in Christ, Greetings from India!

I hope our friends in the US are getting ready to enjoy the summer season. In India, we have been experiencing heat waves in May with temperatures ranging from 115-118 Fahrenheit. Typically, monsoons bring relief from the heat during first weeks of June but the monthly forecast predicts less rain and higher than normal temperature.

While the extreme heat is challenging, the larger concern is the increasing Christian opposition and persecution across India. The ongoing harassment has also impacted GBBM as our CPPs and leaders have cancelled many church services due to threats and harassment.

But, even in this increasingly hostile situation, we know that God is good, and we look to Him for His guidance, protection, and His will. The GBBM leaders and CPPs shared the Gospel in April with 5,714 people, 3,588 children were ministered to in VBS and children's programs. We praise Jesus as 189 people placed their faith in Him and 28 people were baptized. We praise God for the opportunity to share the Gospel among the Banjara people.

Aletheia Banjara School is scheduled to reopen June 12<sup>th</sup>, 2023. If we do not receive relief from the heat, we will need to delay the opening. Please pray that God will provide cooler weather as teachers are scheduled to return to ABS June 1<sup>st</sup> to prepare for the new school year.

Thank you for joining hands with us as we share the Good News with the lost Banjara people in the remote villages of India.

Recently the extremely hot weather has impacted the ability to meet with people as they are very restless and less willing to meet and listen to the Good News. The increasing opposition has also created additional concern and caution among the lost Banjara people. Please pray that the Lord strengthens the CPPs and



GBBM leaders to overcome these challenges and that the lost will have ears to hear the Good News and that they realize and understand that once they have Jesus, they will have a peace that will allow them to rest in Him no matter the weather or man's opposition.

Young Adult Awareness Camp: CPP Narsu Naik Boda took an original approach to share the gospel with the young adults who were home in the villages for

summer vacation. Because the "visitors" would not attend a Christian meeting, Pastor Narsu planned an awareness and career guidance meeting in a centrally located



village. The County Police Inspector was invited as a special guest. Before the Inspector arrived to speak, Narsu and his team sang a couple of Christian songs and shared the creation story, the origin of man and how sin entered the world and became the root cause for all of today's problems. Many attendees expressed interest in learning more about the stories. Over a hundred young adults attended the meeting. CPP Boda knows many of the young adults and their families and will follow-up with them.

**Children Camps:** GBBM uses the summer months to host Vacation Bible School and children camps. The events kicked off April 25th. Since then, the GBBM CPPs have been busy conducting VBS or children camps when they visit a village. While
