Dear Brethren in Christ, greetings from India!

We hope this newsletter finds our friends and partners doing well. In India, our state has not received enough rain. Water levels have depleted in reservoirs and a scarcity of drinking water is looming. Due to this severe drought, cost have increased, and people are struggling to purchase food. (price of rice has increased 25-30%). Please pray that the Lord brings April rain or early monsoons in May, so the situation does not get worse.

Most months I provide an update on the increasing Christian persecution in India as it seems to intensify daily. The GBBM Church Planting Pastors and church members regularly face increased opposition and difficulties when sharing the Good News of Jesus. As a result, GBBM has been working on improved methods and strategies to reach the unreached Banjara people group. GBBM will focus more this year on training believers to reach their neighbours through sharing the Gospel. GBBM will be using the TCT (Truth Centred Transformation) which is a good fit for our Banjara house churches. Please pray for the implementation of TCT Program for holistic discipleship.

Prime Ministerial elections will be held in seven phases between April 19th and June 1st. The Indian Christian Church will likely go through severe persecution if the same party comes back to power.

We praise God for the ministry results in the month of February 2024. The GBBM team shared the Gospel with 7,420 people, hosted 1,244 children in programs, rejoiced as 225 people accepted Jesus, and 20 people were baptized.


deformities predicting problems. They health abortion suggested as a precautionary measure.

Harish had to take her body to her mother's place for the service. Throughout this tragedy, Harish has maintained a strong faith in his Saviour. ALETHEIA BANJARA SCHOOL UPDATE

Aletheia Banjara School is thriving. As the academic year winds down in April, our teachers and students are fully engaged in their classes. Students are preparing for final exams, and teachers are working on final progress reports.

Medical Camp: A medical camp was held at Aletheia Banjara School in

collaboration with The Lions Club Devarakonda which played a significant role in organizing this event. The medical team from Yashoda Hospitals Hyderabad used their extensive knowledge and experience to benefit the community. Numerous services were offered, such as health check-ups, blood pressure testing, blood sugar level assessments, ECG, eye

exams and distribution of basic medicine. The event promoted community bonding and increased awareness of health and wellness. Over 350 Banjara residents received medical care and guidance.

Self-Governance Day at Aletheia Banjara School: In observance of Self-Governance Day, Aletheia Banjara School (ABS) switched roles between administrators, teachers, and ABS students. The program had the students assume teaching and administrative roles; the student-teacher swap promotes empowerment and responsibility for the students. Students delivered inspirational speeches, led the morning assembly, and recited prayers. ABS students oversaw classes, devotedly and imaginatively taught multiple subjects including science, literature, math, and art. Student administrators managed attendance, records, and minor disciplinary matters in the school office. Students were also in charge of managing the lunch line and serving meals to students. The idea that every student has the capacity to lead, inspire,
